2020 was so incredibly challenging for us all. Despite it being the hardest, most challenging year of my Chamber career, it was honestly the most rewarding. When we began the shutdown in March, the fear and pain our staff felt for our members and the entire Broken Arrow business community was palpable. But despite the fear and uncertainty, we rose up, responded and were able to serve our members on a level like never before. As you will see through this report, the work of the Chamber did not stop. Honestly, it increased exponentially. Events and networking may have looked different, but we were still connecting our members. We worked with our partners and provided timely information and resources to assist businesses in navigating the crisis. Early on, we partnered with the City and the Broken Arrow Economic Development Corporation and distributed \$140,000 in microgrants to small businesses to help them survive. We were one of the first communities to do so and were able to complete the entire process in a little over two weeks. We created a taskforce BA Rising, that facilitated the distribution of the information, hosted roundtables by industry and at the end produced a positive messaging campaign thanking our community for “rising up” and supporting one another in countless ways. This task force structure was used as a best practice across the state.

Despite all these challenges, our community grew. New business were started, net chamber membership increased, some of our events had record attendance and engagement by our members rose. The Chamber and EDC launched new websites with tools to serve our community, we started a WorkInBA Career Center to get our residents back to work and the employers the staff they need as we move forward. I believe, in this respect, 2021 will be even more of the same: Growth. You, me, all of us, played a crucial role in making sure Broken Arrow made it through. Thank you for the part you played, as a business, employer, teacher, community member, resident, crisis manager and leader. We all wore new hats this year, and we wore them well. Here's to 2021!

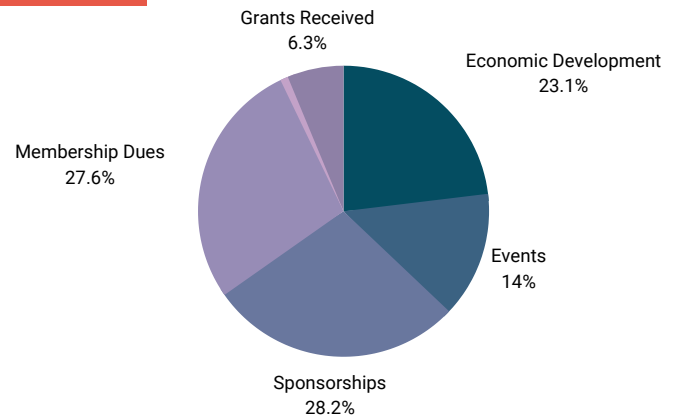

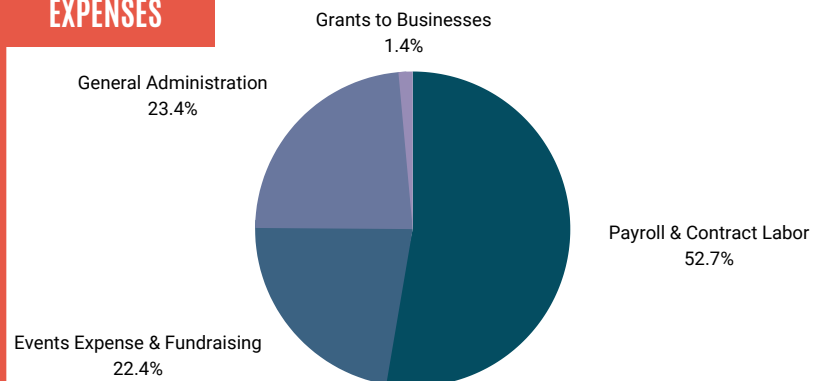

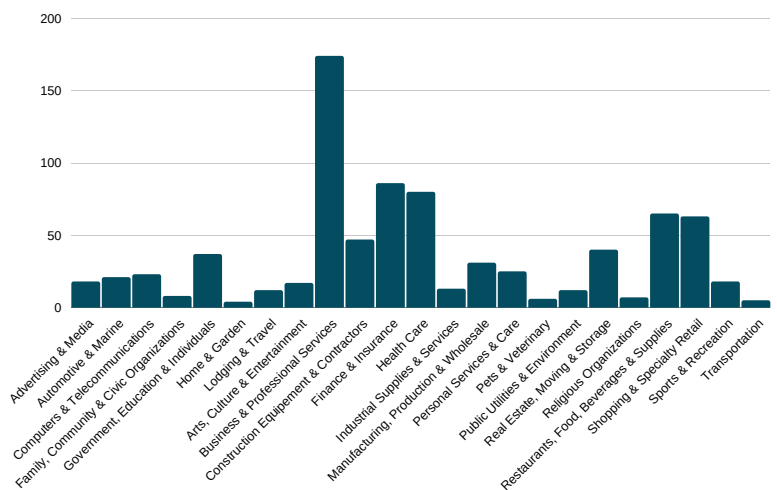

The Broken Arrow Economic Development Corporation strives to create wealth, jobs, and economic growth through the creation, attraction, and retention of business and talent in the community while facilitating innovation and creativity. BAEDC is a partnership of, and governed by, the business community, the municipality and education partners.



Broken Arrow based, CymSTAR announced plans to hire 80-plus new employees over three years. CymSTAR was awarded multiple training system contracts by the US Air Force, in addition to a contract awarded by the US Navy. Combined, CymSTAR is now directly responsible for upgrading and supporting training systems for four critical airborne weapon systems.



The BAEDC partnered with Broken Arrow Public Schools to hold BA Career Day 2020 - Manufacturing. Over 40 volunteers came from 25 different manufacturing companies. Over 1,000 students participated in the day's events.



BAEDC staff utilized CARES funding (through the City of Broken Arrow and Tulsa County) to address workforce development and the changing nature of employment and to meet employers' needs in this uncertain time by creating a virtual and physical career center, WorkInBA and WorkInBA.com.

July 20th - 1,500 cars were served

Typically, Taste of Summer is our annual all-you-can-eat Blue Bell Ice Cream Festival. This year, the event was reimagined in an effort to continue the tradition. The Broken Arrow Chamber, Blue Bell Ice Cream, and Oneta Power partnered with Broken Arrow police and fire departments to give back to the community and spread positivity. Four department locations hosted a drive-thru and distributed free ice cream and goodie bags filled with fun surprises. Price of admission was solely appreciation for our police and fire departments. Car decorations and signs showing support were encouraged.





October 1st - 320 attendees

The most exclusive event of the year is the Main Street Burn Cigar Dinner and it sells out every year. The event is held outside at the Rose District Plaza and includes a steak dinner, a full bar and cigars. This posh evening is filled with networking amongst business and community leaders. There was a silent and live auction, as well as a raffle for a golf cart and a custom knife. This year we sold out at 33 tables, which is 3 more than we sold in 2019.



December 3rd - 436 tickets sold

The Broken Arrow Wine Walk is a fun night of wine tasting, food and shopping in the Rose District. Rose District retailers transform to wine tasting locations for the evening while restaurants hand out tasty treats. It is the perfect way to knock out holiday shopping while having fun and sampling some delicious wines and great food in Broken Arrow's historic arts and entertainment district. This year we sold 50 more tickets than 2019 and added a ninth wine stop. We also had plastic wine glasses with the wine walk branding that were placed in each Wine Walk branded swag bag.



December 17th - 75 participating merchants & 1.7M tickets distributed

Buy Broken Arrow is a our shop local campaign that encourages shopping in Broken Arrow during the holiday season. The campaign gives away a total of \$15,000, split into 3 prizes, \$10,000, \$3,000 and \$2,000. Our three lucky winners this year were Rhonda Bennett from Arrow Flowers & Gifts (\$10,000), Mark Boroughf from Lowes (\$3,000) and Linda Reeves from Reasor's (\$2,000).

Again, this year, we hosted our Small Business Giveaway for our small business merchants (25 employees or less). The merchant with the most #BuyBA posts at the end of every week had a ticket drawn from their store and the winner received a \$250 gift card to the winning merchant's store. The winning merchants for the Facebook contest were Water's Edge Winery, Fleet Feet BA, Star Jewelers, and Pottery World.

Issues for the 2020 agenda were identified by the Broken Arrow Chamber Legislative Committee through membership feedback, city leadership, educational partners, and our strategic partners including the US Chamber of Commerce, Tulsa Regional One Voice Agenda as well as the Oklahoma State Chamber of Commerce.
