
The staff, board of directors and I are all grateful for your investment in Broken Arrow's business voice and business resource. This year,

Major Events



Taste of Summer. our all-voucan-eat ice cream festival. presented by Blue Bell and Kinetic by Windstream is an annual summer tradition in Broken Arrow. The 2023 event greeted over 5,400 attendees despite a reschedule and a rainy day! Attendees consumed 489 gallons of ice cream, which is about 12,225 scoops of ice cream in addition to more than 10,000 snack items! This event also featured food trucks and local vendors. This event provided activities ranging from our vendor marketplace, to our get active zone, and water activity areas to keep cool!

The Annual Gala is a black tie event where the Arrowhead **Business Award winners** are announced and several community leaders are celebrated for their contributions to Broken Arrow. This year's event boasted a Winter Wonderland theme and a rocking after party with entertainment provided by The Get Down Band. 98 different businesses were represented at the 2023 event where sixteen major awards were given.



Rooster Days is a proud Broken Arrow tradition and in 2023. it celebrated its 92nd Anniversary, making it the longest running festival in Oklahoma. The festival takes place at Central Park on Main Street each year. There is something for everyone at Rooster Days, including live entertainment, a parade on Main Street, Miss Rooster Days Pageant, carnival food, carnival rides, cornhole tournament, Rooster Days Run and our ever-expanding marketplace. This year we hosted over 31,000 attendees.



Buy Broken Arrow is our shop local campaign that encourages shopping in Broken arrow during the holiday season. The campaign gives away a total of \$16,000 in cash and prizes, which includes a \$10,000, \$3,000, and \$2,000 in cash awards. This year's program had over 90 participants and featured Buy BA Benjamins- where we surprised one lucky shopper twice a week at a participating merchant with \$100 cash!

US Chamber Awards Broken Arrow Chamber 5-Star Accreditation Status

The U.S. Chamber of Commerce awarded the Broken Arrow Chamber of Commerce with its designation of Accredited with 5 Stars for its sound policies, effective organizational procedures, and positive impact on the community.

The purpose of the U.S. Chamber's Accreditation Program is to facilitate continuing excellence in the chamber industry and to foster a pro-business environment across America. To receive Accreditation, a chamber must meet minimum standards in their operations and programs, including areas of governance, government affairs, communications, and technology. This extensive self-review can take 6-9 months to complete.

Local chambers are rated Accredited, 3-Stars, 4-Stars, or 5-Stars. State chambers are recognized as either Accredited State Chamber or Accredited State Chamber with Distinction. The final determination is made by the Accrediting Board, a committee of U.S. Chamber board members.
